Our Approach

Glasswing's work is rooted in community engagement. We forge partnerships with international and local governments, corporations, non-profits, and civil society, building on, strengthening, and mobilizing existing resources to deliver high impact, sustainable solutions.

Our Work

- Community Schools build *students' core life skills and resilience* through weekly, year-round, extra-curricular programs and psychosocial support
- Provide *out-of-school, unemployed youth* with economic opportunities through leadership, entrepreneurship, and employability training
- Empower *girls* by providing safe spaces and building their social, educational, and financial capabilities
- Train community leaders and public servants (i.e. teachers, medical personnel, police) in *trauma-informed care and restorative practices*
- Support the reintegration of individuals and *families that have been displaced or migrated* through trauma support, education, and job training
- Certify healthcare professionals, law enforcement, and first responders in *emergency life support*
- *Transform public spaces* - such as schools and parks - through *community-led volunteer projects*

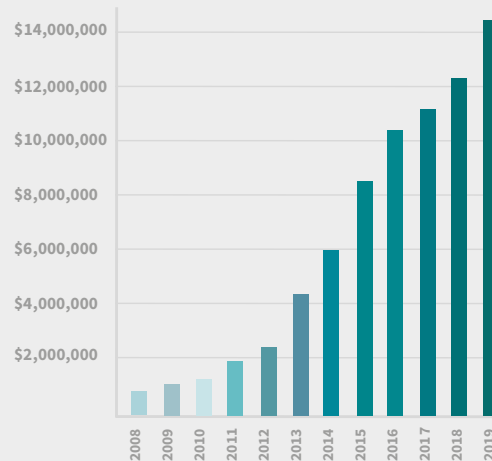
