Our Work

- Build students' life skills through extra-curricular programs and psychosocial support in public schools
- Provide out-of-school, unemployed youth with leadership training, entrepreneurial skills, and access to economic opportunities
- Create safe spaces for girls to build their social networks, education, and financial capabilities
- Train front line workers (e.g. teachers, medical personnel, police) in trauma education and self-care
- Provide humanitarian aid, trauma support, and training for those affected by forced migration in Latin America, as well as migrant youth in New York City
- Mobilize volunteers to transform schools and <u>parks</u> into safe community spaces
- Conduct research and evaluations, and generate evidence to inform policy
